Two letters of recommendation (see form attached) are to be completed by persons (academics, employers) who can critically assess the applicant's ability to do research and advanced courses. Letters of recommendation must be received in a sealed envelope with the referee's signature across the seal, and can be sent directly to our office or be part of a self-administered application.

10. POST SECONDARY EDUCATION

Applicants must provide official transcripts for all post-secondary education irrespective of whether a degree was obtained or not.

Transcripts will be considered official only if received with the verification of the issuing institution as follows:

- The documents must be in a sealed, official university envelope with the official stamp of the university stamped across the seal.
- The transcripts must show grades as well as degree and date awarded.
- Where the degree is not shown on the transcript, the institution should include a copy of the diploma with the transcript.

Transcripts in languages other than English or French must include a certified English (literal) translation. We

do not accept notarized copies unless they are forwarded from the institution to the Notary and the Notary affirms that. Please note these documents must be received in a sealed envelope with the official stamp and signature of the Notary across the seal of the envelope.

International students applying for the Johnson-Shoyama Graduate School and Physics must submit the GRE general test and All other International students are encouraged to submit the results of a GRE, especially the score for the subject test in the discipline being sought.

C. GRADUATE MANAGEMENT ADMISSIONS TEST (GMAT)

Applicants to English, Justice Studies and Police Studies are required to submit a writing sample.

H. SUPPLEMENTARY FORMS:

Applicants to Social Work, Aboriginal Social Work and Physics are required to submit a supplementary form.

I. SLIDES:

Applicants to Visual Arts are required to submit documentation (Slides, CD-Rom or DVD) of recent work (20 images) accompanied by a corresponding sheet indicating title of each work; media; date; dimensions (if applicable). Please send a return envelope with the appropriate postage so that we can return your work.

J. AUDITION:

Applicants for the MMUS in Composition are to submit recent compositions. Applicants for the MMUS in Performance (instrumental or vocal) will perform an in person audition arranged through the Department Head. Only applicants from outside Canada and the U.S. may be considered on the basis of an unedited DVD, certified to be the performance of the applicant. Applicants for the MMUS in Conducting are to submit a DVD recording of approximately 30-45 minutes of unedited rehearsal and performance, including at least 20 minutes of consecutive rehearsal. Written

diagnostic examinations in music theory and history are required.

12. APPLICATION FEE PAYMENT (SUBJECT TO CHANGE)

A \$90.00 (domestic) or \$100 (International) non-refundable application fee must be submitted with your application. Payment may be made by cheque or money order, payable to the University of Regina. Applicants that have a previous University of Regina Identification Number may pay the application fee at the Financial Services Office or Online at UR Self Service.
