The workshop will highlight how this historical context plays a role in the Calls to Action highlighted by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC). The workshop will also examine current Indigenous policy and review engagement strategies and relationshipbuilding tools that public servants can use with Indigenous communities. By the end of this workshop, participants will:1) Understand how historical events, policies and current legislation have shaped the current social, health, and education inequalities for many Indigenous people;2) Be familiar with relationship-building tools and engagement strategies; and,

3) Have the background knowledge necessary to initiate the implementation of selected TRC Calls to Action.
