PARTICIPANTS NEEDED FOR RESEARCH IN ATTITUDES TOWARD OPTIONS FOR REDUCTION OF GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS

We are looking for volunteers to take part in a public engagement study on reducing greenhouse gas emissions in small, remote, or off-grid communities, including assessment of the use of small modular nuclear reactors (SMRs). Participants will include both citizens and specialists.

As a *citizen participant* in this study, you would be asked to attend an information meeting from 7-8:30pm on Sept. 30th, 2019 and take part in two focus group discussions (120 minutes each) during early October and early November. As a *specialist participant* in this study, you would be asked to take part in two software-assisted interviews lasting 60-90 minutes each. ADDITIONALLY: All participants (both citizens and specialists) will be asked to take part in a one-day workshop running from 10:30am to 3:30pm on Saturday, October 26th, 2019. All participants will also be asked to fill out a questionnaire at the beginning and end of the study.
