Policy Brief: Context

- U.S.-Canada relationship is complex, rich and asymmetrical
- It has enriched both economies
- Canada is the United States largest market
- The Canada-U.S. border is safe and secure
- Canada enjoys U.S. protection and profits from its markets
- Key comparative advantage is Canada's proximity to U.S
- Arrive of Trump administration presents unique challenges



Policy Brief: Considerations

- Canada has taken a passive diplomatic approach to U.S.
- Goal has been to keep relationship "under the radar"
- Now the relationship has been fundamentally transformed
- Canadian sovereignty is being challenged by Trump
- Economic and trade relationship threatened by U.S. tariffs
- Our long-standing U.S. diplomacy has become obsolete
- Need to rethink our diplomatic approach with the U.S.
